Interstate 215 Widening Project – Phase 4 Begins Update #1

San Bernardino – Construction is scheduled to begin on Phase 4 of the Interstate 215 Widening Project on January 11, 2010. Caltrans is the lead agency on this phase which spans from Massachusetts Avenue to University Parkway. Caltrans awarded the contract to MCM Construction in mid November with their bid coming in at \$65.5 million, approximately \$38 million under the engineers estimate.

Phase 4 will consist of constructing freeway ramps connecting I-215 and SR-210, bridge reconstruction at Massachusetts Avenue, Highland Avenue and 27th Street, addition of a southbound auxiliary lane from University Parkway to the I-215/SR-210 interchange and new northbound general use lane, addition of soundwalls and aesthetic improvements and improved local streets and drainage systems.

To minimize any inconvenience to motorists, work will be conducted behind K-rail during the day or at nighttime when lane closures are necessary. Many lane, ramp and full closures are expected throughout the project and Caltrans will keep you apprised of this work. In order to keep you moving and on time we have provided the most recent work schedule below. Detour signs will be posted.
