Hathaway Creek Bridge Replacement Work Begins

San Bernardino— The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) has started work on State Route 38 (SR-38) to rehabilitate the Hathaway Creek Bridge near Barton Flats in the San Bernardino Mountains. The project will replace the bridge deck and approach slabs, and upgrade the pavement and bridge rails. The project will also reconstruct lanes and the outside shoulder slab, improve drainage, grind existing pavement, and retrofit the bridge abutment with bolsters.

One-way traffic control will be necessary for the duration of the project, through early 2016. Flagging begins today, Thursday, April 2 until a solar powered, one way traffic control signal is in place. The solar signal will be activated on Monday, April 20. Work hours are Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., however the one way traffic control will be in place at all times.

Motorists are advised to pay attention to all traffic signs and signals, instructions from flaggers, and use extreme caution when traveling through the work zone. Delays are expected to be approximately 15 minutes in duration. At times delays could be up to 30 minutes depending on traffic flow and equipment/material movement.

Motorists are encouraged to use SR 330 and SR 18 when driving to Big Bear to avoid delays. Project benefits include improved access for increased truck traffic and new pavement with extended life requiring less maintenance.
