## **CALTRANS COMPLETES “I-215 SPRING STING” – NO STAURDAY NIGHT CLOSURE**

**SAN BERNARDINO** – Caltrans, Ames Construction, and Stinger Bridge and Iron have completed the “I-215 Spring Sting” bridge work on Interstate 215 (I-215) between Riverside and San Bernardino in Grand Terrace. Therefore, full closure of I-215 from Saturday night to Sunday morning, April 26-27, will not be necessary.

Caltrans District 8 Director, Basem Muallem, commented, “The innovative planning and orchestration of Caltrans personnel, Ames Construction, and Stinger Bridge and Iron to erect the bridges onsite and install them in one month, saved motorists from having to endure major traffic impacts over a long period of time.”

**Caltrans expresses our gratitude to the public for their cooperation and use of the alternate routes to avoid major impacts through the detours. We would also like to thank the media for dispersing information and keeping motorists informed.**

Joseph Carlo, Project Manager for Ames Construction states, “The preparation and execution from all parties lead to an overall successful program. The work to erect the final two trusses and complete the final bridge has begun on scene and we expect to move it into place in late summer.”

The railroad bridge moves were part of the \$170 million I-215 Bi County project which is constructing carpool lanes in both directions of I-215 between Riverside and San Bernardino. Caltrans is partnering with San Bernardino Associated Governments (SANBAG) and Riverside County Transportation Commission (RCTC) to meet the High Occupancy Vehicle (HOV) lane gap between the two counties.
