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## **60/91/215 INTERCHANGE CLOSURES SCHEDULED**

**RIVERSIDE** – The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will conduct three full freeway closures in conjunction with the 60/91/215 Interchange Project.

Wednesday, May 9 <sup>th</sup> & Thursday, May 10 <sup>th</sup>	WB SR-91 from the 60/91/215 Interchange to Mission Inn Avenue	9:00 p.m. – 5:00 a.m.
Thursday, May 10 <sup>th</sup> & Friday, May 11 <sup>th</sup>	SB 215 at Blaine Street	9:00 p.m. – 4:00 a.m. 11:00 p.m. – 7:00 a.m.

During the northbound 215 closure, crews will be pouring cement for bridge deck construction. During the westbound 91 closure, crews will be working on the freeway’s new drainage system. The closure of the southbound 215 at Blaine Street will accommodate bridgework. For obvious safety reasons, for both motorists and crews, full closures are required. Motorists traveling through the area will use the detour indicated below. Caltrans asks that motorists allow for extra time as delays are expected.

**Detour for Northbound 215/Eastbound 91:** Motorists on the eastbound 91 will take the southbound 215 to the University off ramp. They can then re-enter the northbound 215 at University and continue to the northbound 215 at the 60/91/215 Interchange.

**Detour for the Westbound 91:** Motorists on the southbound 215 can take the westbound 60 to Market Street. Take Market Street to University Street and re-enter the westbound 91 at the University Street on ramp.

**Detour for the Southbound 215 at Blaine Street:** Motorists will exit the freeway at the southbound Blaine Street exit and re-enter there at the Blaine Street on ramp. Closure is at the Blaine Street Bridge.
