STATE ROUTE 142 (CARBON CANYON), FROM BREA HILLS AVENUE TO SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY LINE, RESURFACING AC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will be commencing a project to perform work on a four-mile stretch of State Route 142, Carbon Canyon, from Brea Hills Avenue to San Bernardino County Line. State Route 142, Carbon Canyon Road is a two lane (one in each direction) roadway. The project will require lane closure and would have major impact on local community commute.

The contractor for this project is All American Asphalt. The project will consist of grinding the existing roadway and resurfacing with asphalt concrete (AC) in both directions and miscellaneous related work. The project will begin June 18, 2012 and finish with an anticipated date of late September 2012.

Work will be performed on weeknights from 9:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. The contractor will also be working four weekends with tentative dates of July 14, July 21, July 28 and August 4. The work weekend schedule will be between 9:00 am to 8:00 p.m. Caltrans will provide all necessary updates as they become available.

Disclaimer: Due to unforeseen operational factors or inclement weather, these times and dates may change.

The work is being done to preserve and extend the pavement life to provide a smoother surface that greatly enhances the ride quality along Carbon Canyon.
