### **NEARLY \$1 BILLION IN FUNDING ALLOCATED TO IMPROVE TRANSPORTATION AND STATE'S ECONOMIC GROWTH**

**INLAND EMPIRE** – Continuing the drive to rebuild California's infrastructure and spur job growth, the California Transportation Commission has allocated nearly \$1 billion to 135 transportation projects statewide.

Approximately \$600 million in funding was provided by Proposition 1B, a transportation bond approved by voters in 2006. The remaining allocations came from assorted state and federal transportation accounts. In total, about \$13.8 billion in Proposition 1B funds have been distributed statewide.

"Proposition 1B continues to fund key transportation projects, which translates into a strengthened economy," said Caltrans Director Malcolm Dougherty. "Investing in our infrastructure will improve mobility and create a better future for Californians."

Some of the notable local projects that received funding include:

**Caltrans/San Bernardino Associated Governments (SANBAG)** – I-215 Newport Avenue Bridge Replacement Project in Grand Terrace (\$3.1 million).

**City of Fontana/San Bernardino Associated Governments (SANBAG)** – I-15 Duncan Canyon Road Interchange Project in Fontana (\$12 million).

**Caltrans/San Bernardino Associated Governments (SANBAG)** – I-215 Bi-County HOV Gap Closure in San Bernardino and Riverside counties (\$158 million).

**City of Riverside/Riverside County Transportation Commission (RCTC)** – Streater Avenue Grade Separation in Riverside (\$15.5 million).

**City of Highland/San Bernardino Associated Governments (SANBAG) – SR-210/Greenspot Road Improvements in Highland (\$1 million).**

**Caltrans – Rehabilitate pavement on Interstate 15 (30 lane miles) in Corona (\$364,000).**

**Caltrans – Rehabilitate pavement on Interstate 215 (32.7 lane miles) in Riverside, Grand Terrace, and Colton (\$245,000).**

**Caltrans – Install rumble strips on Route 95 south of Needles. (\$272,000).**

**Caltrans – Construct concrete median barrier on Route 210 in Rancho Cucamonga and Fontana (\$2 million).**

**Caltrans – Rehabilitate pavement on Interstate 40 (100 lane miles) in San Bernardino County (\$26 million\*\*).**

**Caltrans – Rehabilitate pavement on Interstate 40 (84 lane miles) in San Bernardino County (\$30 million\*\*).**

**Caltrans – Rehabilitate pavement on Interstate 40 (65 lane miles) in San Bernardino County (\$23 million\*\*).**

**Caltrans – Rehabilitate pavement on State Route 62 (70 lane miles) in Twenty Nine Palms and Yucca Valley (\$20 million\*\*).**

**San Bernardino Associated Governments (SANBAG) – Route 210 landscape project in San Bernardino (\$2.5 million).**

**Town of Apple Valley/San Bernardino Associated Governments (SANBAG) – State Route 18 landscape enhancement in Apple Valley (\$464,000).**
