INTERSTATE 10 TEX WASH BRIDGE UPDATE

RIVERSIDE – The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) continues work on Interstate 10 (I-10) at Tex Wash Bridge, near Desert Center. Demolition of the collapsed eastbound bridge was completed on Friday, July 31, 2015 at 10:00 a.m. Demolition included the removal of three spans—beginning with the collapsed span. Following the approval of a conceptual design, re-building of the eastbound bridge is anticipated to begin within a week.

The westbound bridge is open and being used by traffic for both directions of travel. Traffic delays have been minimal. The speed limit has been reduced to 45 miles per hour within the construction zone.

To date, project cost is estimated at \$5 million. Cost includes the strengthening and temporary traffic configuration of the westbound bridge, as well as the demolition of the eastbound bridge. The completion goal of the new bridge remains late September 2015—contingent upon weather conditions. The goal will be accomplished, in part, with the use of precast materials and an accelerated work schedule.
