NEW LANE CONFIGURATION TO BEGIN ON INTERSTATE 15 (I-15) CAJON PASS

San Bernardino, CA – The I-15 Cajon Pass Rehabilitation Project from Kenwood Avenue to Highway 395 continues with a new north and southbound lane configuration. The \$120 million project is replacing concrete slabs in the Cajon Pass that are beyond their life cycle. The replaced slab will extend the life of the pavement (for up to 40 years) with minimal maintenance.

The new lane configuration (traffic split) begins at Kenwood Avenue to 1.5 miles south of Cleghorn Road, and will be in place for about six weeks. The northbound split will begin on Thursday, January 22. Traffic lanes will be split at the center of the roadway at a k-rail (temporary barrier) divider. The northbound split is approximately 1.5 miles long. Construction will take place on the existing middle lanes of both northbound lanes where the split will exist. The traffic split is anticipated to revert to its normal configuration on March 6, 2015.

Shoulder access is limited throughout the project; we ask that motorists do not use the existing shoulders to allow for emergency responder access. **Vehicles blocking emergency response vehicles may be cited.** Remember that a **60 MPH speed limit will be strictly enforced** by CHP and that construction zones are subject to double fines.

Please “**ease up on the gas in the Pass**”, slow down and be alert for road workers, law enforcement, emergency responders, and tow trucks and their drivers.
