## STATE ROUTE 142 GETS NEW PAVEMENT IN CHINO HILLS

**CHINO HILLS** – The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) announces the beginning of a repaving project on State Route 142 in Chino Hills between State Route 71 and the Orange County line. The work is scheduled to begin on September 6, 2006 and will continue until approximately mid-October.

The contractor will be working primarily at night Monday through Friday between the hours of 7:00 pm and 5:30 am. Signs will also be posted on State Route 142 to notify motorists of closures prior to the project site. In line with safety, this project site will require a reduction in lanes in various locations to complete this work. Motorist will still have access to State Route 142 but may experience minor delays. See below for details.
