### **CALIFORNIA TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION APPROVES NEARLY \$300 MILLION IN PROJECTS TO HELP MOTORISTS GET AROUND CALIFORNIA**

**SAN BERNARDINO** – The California Transportation Commission today allocated \$287 million to 23 projects that will provide better roads, transit, and bridges while at the same time strengthening California’s economy.

“We are building transportation improvements that will benefit the state for decades and will also boost job growth in every region of California,” said Caltrans Director Malcolm Dougherty.

The allocations include \$259 million from Proposition 1B, a transportation bond approved by voters in 2006. In total, nearly \$14.6 billion in Proposition 1B funds have been distributed statewide.

The remaining \$28 million in allocations came from assorted transportation accounts funded by state and federal dollars.

Among the projects that received funding today were:

**City of Indio/Riverside County Transportation Commission (RCTC)** – Monroe Street improvements in the City of Indio from Avenue 49 to Avenue 52. (\$1.375 million)

**Caltrans District 8** – I-15 in Cajon Pass north of Kenwood Avenue to repair culverts and damaged slopes. (\$2.2 million)
